Welcome to the Leeds Opera Festival 2021!

We are delighted to be bringing live performance back to Leeds this Summer, with 20 events taking place in 9 venues across the city.

We had hoped to perform this Holst programme back in 2020, but with the huge logistical and financial challenges of the pandemic, this wasn't possible. Instead we postponed for 12 months which means that we can bring you the full Holst-fest this Summer!

Whilst Holst may have only written four works for stage, his output is hugely varied; making him an excellent subject for our Festival.

Alongside our headline double-bill of *Savitri* and *At the Boar's Head*, we're visiting 7 venues across Leeds with *The Wandering Scholar*, music making with young families and *Made* with *Music*, focusing on English composers with a *lunchtime concert*, and hosting a week long *exhibition* on the hidden 300 year history of opera in Leeds ... quite a lot to pack in to a bank holiday weekend!


